Case Key Truth

The Bible is the only Book that is God's Word to us.

God has spoken to us through His Word, the Bible. That is amazing to think about! The God Who created the universe has something to say to us!

So what is God's important message to us? God's Word lets us know what He is like and what He has done so that we might know Him personally.

Nothing else is as important as God's message to us. We should want to know it well. This TruthBook will guide you in learning about God's message to you. You will discover that God's Word is completely reliable because it comes from God.

Everything God says is true!

The Bible is the greatest Book that could ever be written because it is the only Book that is God's Word to us! We should search it like a detective looking for important clues—the most important clues that could ever be found!

The Bible Is God's Book

Q. What is the Bible?

A. The Bible is the only inspired written Word of God, above all other books in wisdom, power, and authority.

1 Thessalonians 2:13b

"When ye received the word of God which ye heard of us, ye received it not as the word of men, but as it is in truth, the word of God, which effectually worketh also in you that believe."



A Closer Look

Every second of every day, millions of people around the world post electronic messages of some sort. The number of posts per year is in the hundreds of billions and growing. But there is one message that is better and greater than every one of those hundreds of billions of posts. That message is from God in the form of the Bible.

The Bible is everything God wants us to know about Him. It is God's message to

us. It is our official guidebook for all we are to believe. That is why this TruthBook is all about what the Bible says.


God gave us His Word to teach us about Himself. We can know for sure what God is like by looking into His Word.



Investigate It!

Read **1 Peter 1:22–25**. Answer the questions.

"Incorruptible" means "unable to decay, die, or be destroyed." Peter calls the Word





of God “incorruptible seed” because it could never be done away with.

How long will God’s Word last (v. 23)?

What are two “corruptible” things that wither and fall away (v. 24)?

What is preached to us by the Word of God (v. 25)?

Our efforts to take away our sins are like grass and flowers that eventually die. Those efforts are “corruptible.” They will always fail. Salvation comes only through the gospel as found in God’s Word. The gospel is God’s good news about how to be saved.

What does a seed do? Why do you think God’s Word is compared to a seed?



Heart Inspection

Has God’s Word changed you? What are some things you have learned about Him through His Word?



Bonus Q & A

Q. How does God carry out His will in the world?

A. Just as God used His Word to create the world, He also uses it to carry out His will in the world. **Isaiah 55:11a** – “So shall

my word be that goeth forth out of my mouth: it shall not return unto me void, but it shall accomplish that which I please.”

Q. What is the greatest theme of the entire Bible?

A. The greatest theme throughout the entire Bible is the Lord Jesus Christ. **Luke 24:27** – “And beginning at Moses and all the prophets, he [Christ] expounded unto them in all the scriptures the things concerning himself.”

A. The Spirit of God helps us know
that the Bible is true
and that it is God's Word.

1 Corinthians 2:12

“Now we have received,
not the spirit of the world,
but the spirit which is of God;
that we might know the things
that are freely given to us of God.”



A Closer Look


First Corinthians 2:12 shows that the “spirit which is of God” is not the same as the “spirit of the world.” The “spirit of the world” refers to the rebellious, disobedient sin nature that we inherit from our parents. We are born with this sin nature. Satan, the “prince of the power of the air,” lives according to the spirit of this world.

Ephesians 2:2 says, “Wherein in time past ye walked according to the course of



this world, according to the prince of the power of the air, the spirit that now worketh in the children of disobedience.”

God gives believers His Spirit so they might know God's Word. God's Word tells them the "things that are freely given to us of God." When 1 Corinthians 2:12 speaks of knowing the things given to believers by God, it refers to a personal knowledge of God's Word. That kind of knowledge is more than just knowing some facts about the Bible. It means having personal confidence that the things of God revealed in His Word are absolutely true. When we know the Bible is true, we can confidently put our trust in what it says.

A. Yes. **1 John 4:6** – “We are of God: he that knoweth God heareth us; he that is not of God heareth not us. Hereby know we the spirit of truth, and the spirit of error.”

Q. Why did believers in Jesus' day have assurance that Jesus' teachings were from God?

A. God gave believers the ability to recognize Jesus' teachings as divine. **John 7:17** – “If any man will do his [God's] will, he shall know of the doctrine [teachings], whether it be of God, or whether I speak of myself.”

God Used **Holy** Men to **Write** Down **His Words**

A Closer Look

Second Peter 1:21 says that the Holy Spirit “moved” the writers of the Bible. That doesn’t mean He picked up the writers and moved them to another place. It means the Holy Spirit worked in their minds so that they wrote exactly what He wanted written. No “prophecy,” a reference to the Bible, came about because a writer decided to speak for God. So no part of the Bible originated with


(started from) the human writers. The words originated with God!

God used human writers to write His words like a carpenter uses a hammer to build a house. God is the original author. He used the writers as His tools to write exactly what He wanted the Bible to say.



Investigate It!

Bonus Q & A

Q. Are the New Testament writers as reliable as the Old Testament writers?

A. Yes. All those writers were moved by the Holy Spirit to write down God’s exact words. **2 Peter 3:2** – “That ye may be mindful of the words which were spoken before by the holy prophets, and of the commandment of us the apostles of the Lord and Saviour.”

Q. Did the holy men write the Bible exactly as God wished?

A. Yes. He had them write it just as if He had written every word Himself.



The Bible Teaches Us to Believe God's Truth



Memorize It!

A. No. God's Word is true because God tells only the truth.

Psalms 119:160

"Thy word is true from the beginning: and every one of thy righteous judgments endureth for ever."



A Closer Look

When **Psalms 119:160** says, "Thy word is true from the beginning," it means that all of God's words are always true. He cannot lie or even make a mistake when He speaks. Everything God put in His Word from Genesis to Revelation is true.


The Bible did record lies that various people or Satan told, but the record of those lies is accurate. And the Bible is correct when it calls them lies.

So when we read God's Word, we can be confident that it is teaching us right things. All God's words in the Old Testament + all God's words in the New Testament = TRUTH. In other words: TRUTH + TRUTH = TRUTH.

A. The Bible accurately records lies Satan and various people told, but it never presents those lies as truth. For example, the Bible accurately records Jacob's lie to his father, Isaac.

Q. Will the Bible ever cease to exist?

A. No. God's Word is eternal. **1 Peter 1:25** – "But the word of the Lord endureth for ever. And this is the word which by the gospel is preached unto you."



The Bible Is **All** about **God**



Memorize It!

Q. What does the Bible teach us?

A. The Bible teaches what God wants us to believe about Him and how He wants us to behave before Him.

Ecclesiastes 12:13b


“Fear God,
and keep his commandments:
for this is the whole duty of man.”



A Closer Look

Ecclesiastes 12:13 says that the “duty of man” is to “fear God” and “keep his commandments.” To fear God means to have a respect and wonder for God. It means to respond to God according to His character and abilities. So in order to fear God, we must learn His character and abilities. The best way to learn what God is like is to study the Bible. In the Bible we find out specific truths about God.

Ecclesiastes 12:13 also talks about keeping God's commandments. To keep God's commands simply means to obey God. When we learn God's commands in the Bible, we learn more about what He is like, for God's commands teach us about the character of God. For example, God commands us in **Ephesians 4:32** to be kind to one another and to forgive one another. The reason for those commands is based on what God is like. Ephesians 4:32 says, "And be ye kind one to another, tenderhearted, forgiving one another, even





as God for Christ's sake hath forgiven you.”
God commands us to be kind and forgiving
because He is that way!

A. We know that God exists by observing
His Creation, by recognizing our own sense
of right and wrong, and by reading what
God says about Himself in the Bible.



God's Word **Cannot** Be **Destroyed**



Memorize It!

Q. Can we be sure that God's Word is still good and true for us today?

A. Yes. God's Word is good and true forever. It never changes.

Matthew 5:18b

"Till heaven and earth pass, one jot or one tittle shall in no wise pass from the law, till all be fulfilled."



A Closer Look

Jesus sat down with His disciples on a mountain to give them an important message about the Law and Prophets (Matthew 5:18). The Law and Prophets is what Jesus called the Old Testament. He wanted to communicate to His disciples how long the Old Testament would last and whether all of God's promises in it would come true.

Jesus began by talking about the letters of the Hebrew alphabet. Hebrew is the

language writers such as Moses and David used when writing books of the Old Testament. In **Matthew 5:18** Jesus said, "One jot or one tittle shall in no wise pass from the law, till all be fulfilled." A "jot" is the smallest Hebrew letter. It has a "y" sound in Hebrew words. A "tittle" is the smallest part of a Hebrew letter. A tittle makes one letter slightly different from another letter. Look at the Hebrew word below. Point to the jot and tittle. Also note that Hebrew is written and read from right to left rather than left to right.

Jesus was very sure the promises in the Old Testament would come true. He even said that it would be easier for all of Creation (heaven and earth) to disappear than it would be for God's Word to not come true. There is nothing in all of Creation that could stop God's Word from coming true. God's Word cannot be destroyed. It will last forever. And all that it says about the future will come true.

Bonus Q & A

Q. Is the Bible we have today just as true as it was when it was written?

A. Yes. God has promised to preserve His Word, and He has! **Matthew 24:35** – “Heaven and earth shall pass away, but my words shall not pass away.”

Q. How long has God's Word existed?

A. God's Word has existed forever in Heaven. **Psalms 119:89** – “For ever, O LORD, thy word is settled in heaven.”



God **Gave** the **Bible** So That We Might **Believe** in **Christ**



Memorize It!

Q. Why do we need the Bible?

A. We need the Bible to show us Who God is and how we can be right with Him.

2 Timothy 3:15b

“The holy scriptures . . . are able to make thee wise unto salvation through faith which is in Christ Jesus.”



A Closer Look

When **2 Timothy 3:15** says Timothy knew God’s Word “from a child,” it could mean that he had heard it as a tiny baby. Perhaps his mother read him the Scriptures before he could even understand them!


As a child, Timothy did not have the whole Bible because the New Testament was yet to be written. The word “scriptures” in 2 Timothy 3:15 means the Old Testament.

The Old Testament includes passages

about Jesus coming to earth to die on the cross for our sins. Isaiah, for example, wrote a lot about Jesus and our need for a Savior. He wrote that every person is like a sheep lost in the wilderness (Isaiah 53:6). He meant that people, like lost sheep, are helpless and in need of being rescued. The sheep need to be rescued from danger. People need to be rescued from their sins.

Isaiah also wrote that the punishment for our sins is death and separation from God. But Jesus died in our place so that we might be saved from our sins. **Isaiah**

53:5a says, “But he was wounded for





our transgressions, he was bruised for our iniquities.” Jesus took the punishment for our sins when He was wounded and bruised and then put on the cross to die. He then rose from the dead to offer us eternal life. In order to be saved from our sins, we must believe in Jesus, trusting His death on the cross as the payment for our sins (Acts 16:31).

A. The Spirit of God uses the Bible to show sinners that they need to believe in Christ. **1 John 5:13a** – “These things have I written unto you that believe on the name of the Son of God; that ye may know that ye have eternal life.”

Q. What is one verse that teaches we must know God in order to be saved?

A. John 17:3 – “And this is life eternal, that they might know thee the only true God, and Jesus Christ, whom thou hast sent.”



God's Word Reveals the Only Way to Be Saved



Memorize It!

- A.** We get to know God by faith, which comes from hearing His Word.
- Romans 10:17**
- “So then faith cometh by hearing, and hearing by the word of God.”




A Closer Look

When **Romans 10:17** says that saving faith comes by hearing God's Word shared, it does not mean that every person who hears God's Word will be saved. Some people will reject God's Word when they hear it. Others will try to change what the Bible teaches about salvation so that it fits their own beliefs. But no one has the right to change what the Bible says. True believers have faith in what God's Word says, not

in what they want it to say. True believers say, “I will believe what the Bible teaches, especially about salvation.”

In order for people to believe the gospel, they must first hear it shared from the Bible. The Holy Spirit then uses the gospel to work in the hearers' hearts to cause them to see their need for salvation from their sins. The Holy Spirit makes the gospel amazingly powerful!

The gospel is the only true message of salvation. All other messages telling people how to be rescued from their sins are false.





We should always trust what the Bible says about salvation and reject all other messages.

A. No. Acts 10:43 – “To him [Christ] give all the prophets witness, that through

his name whosoever believeth in him shall receive remission of sins.”

Q. Can a Christian become more like Christ without studying and learning the Bible?

A. No. John 8:31, 32 – “Then said Jesus to those Jews which believed on him, If ye continue in my word, then are ye my disciples indeed; and ye shall know the truth, and the truth shall make you free.”



God's Word Has the Highest Authority

A Closer Look

When **2 Timothy 3:16** says the Bible was “given by inspiration of God,” it means that God moved men to write each of His words exactly as He wanted them written. The word “inspiration” literally means “God-breathed.” Every word of Scripture has been breathed out by God. Just like musicians blow through instruments to produce the sounds they want, so God breathed His words through men to

produce the Bible. They wrote what God put in their minds to write.


In 2 Timothy 3:16 God says His Word is profitable (useful, helpful, needed) for four reasons.

Doctrine – God’s Word teaches us what to believe. It says, “Here’s what’s right.”

Reproof – God’s Word convinces us of our sin. It says, “Here’s what’s wrong.”

Correction – God’s Word corrects our sinful ways. It says, “Here’s how to make right what’s wrong.”

Instruction in righteousness – God’s





Word leads us to act and live in a way pleasing to God. It says, “Here’s how to keep right what is right.”

A. Yes. God commands us to submit to the Bible’s authority. **Psalm 119:4** – “Thou hast commanded us to keep thy precepts diligently.”



God's **Children** Should **Love His Word**


A Closer Look

The person who wrote **Psalms 119:97** said that he had loved God's Word and that he would continue to love it throughout his days. God's Word filled his thoughts every day as he considered how wonderful it is and how joyful it made him feel. To meditate on God's Word is to think about it over and over again, considering what it means and how it applies to our lives. Thinking about God's Word most certainly

made the writer eager to trust and obey it.

Anyone who truly loves God will have a similar love for God's Word. In fact, a love for God's Word is strong evidence that a person actually loves God.

The Bible gives us a lot of reasons to love it. For one, it tells us how wonderful and powerful God is. It also tells us the story of God's sacrificial love for all people. There is no greater story of love in all the world. And God's Word tells us how to live in a way that is pleasing to God.

2 John 1:9 – "Whosoever transgresseth, and abideth not in the doctrine [teachings] of Christ, hath not God. He that abideth in the doctrine of Christ, he hath both the Father and the Son."

Q. What should our attitude be toward the Bible?

A. We should have an attitude of love for God's Word. **1 Peter 2:2** – "As newborn babes, desire the sincere milk of the word, that ye may grow thereby."

1 Thessalonians 2:13b – “When ye received the word of God which ye heard of us, ye received it not as the word of men, but as it is in truth, the word of God, which effectually worketh also in you that believe.”

Q. How can we know that the Bible really is the true Word of God?

A. The Spirit of God helps us know that the Bible is true and that it is God's Word.

1 Corinthians 2:12 – “Now we have received, not the spirit of the world, but the

spirit which is of God; that we might know the things that are freely given to us of God.”

Q. How did God give us the Bible?

A. God gave holy men His words to write down. **2 Peter 1:21** – “For the prophecy came not in old time by the will of man: but holy men of God spake as they were moved by the Holy Ghost.”

Q. Does the Bible teach any errors or lies?

A. No. God's Word is true because God tells only the truth. **Psalms 119:160** – “Thy word is true from the beginning: and every one of thy righteous judgments endureth for ever.”

Q. What does the Bible teach us?

A. The Bible teaches what God wants us to believe about Him and how He wants us to behave before Him. **Ecclesiastes 12:13b** – “Fear God, and keep his commandments: for this is the whole duty of man.”


