Adventure Key Truth

The Bible is the only Book that is God's Word to us.

The perfect, all-powerful, one true God authored the Bible, God's Word. Amazingly, God has spoken to us through the Bible, telling us everything we need to know about Himself. The Bible tells us that all life comes from God. Without God, nothing could exist. The Bible also tells us that all life exists for God. He is the reason we live. And most importantly, the Bible tells us how to be right with God so we can someday live with Him forever.

The Bible is the guide to spiritual truth. Knowing this, the historical figure Patrick Henry reportedly said, "The Bible is worth all the other books which have ever been printed." Actually, the Bible is worth more than all the world's books, money, and gold combined!

As our guide to spiritual truth, the Bible is the foundation for everything we know about God. That is why this TruthBook begins with understanding the Bible. In the first section, you will memorize ten important truths about the Bible, the most important book of all time.



2 Timothy 3:16 – "All scripture is given by inspiration of God, and is profitable for doctrine, for reproof, for correction, for instruction in righteousness."

2 Peter 1:21 – "For the prophecy came not in old time by the will of man: but holy men of God spake as they were moved by the Holy Ghost."

































• What is the Bible?

A. The Bible is the only inspired written Word of God, above all other books in wisdom, power, and authority.

1 Thessalonians 2:13

"For this cause also thank we God without ceasing, because, when ye received the word of God which ye heard of us, ye received it not as the word of men, but as it is in truth, the word of God, which effectually worketh also in you that believe."



Millions of books exist all over the world in homes, libraries, schools, and on the Internet. But the Bible is different than all those books because it tells us everything God wants us to know about Himself. The Bible is God's Book to us. This TruthBook focuses on the Bible and will help you understand God's message to you.

Some people don't believe the Bible is God's Book. Some of those people use other books as their guide for life. Others simply do what they feel like doing, ignoring God's Book. Rejecting or ignoring the truth that the Bible is God's Book is serious. It is the same as rejecting God.



Did You Know?

Did you know that the Bible is one Book made up of 66 smaller books? Those 66 books were written by 40 or so different writers over a period of about 1,600 years (16 centuries). Some of the people God used to write down His words were kings, while others were ordinary people. One was a well-educated doctor, and another was a poorly-educated fisherman. God used each one of them, no matter their career or education level, to write His perfect Word just the way He wanted it to be written.



Q. By what other name is the Bible known?

A. The Bible is also called the "Scriptures." The word "Scriptures" means "holy writings." Some other religions call their books "scriptures" too, but God's inspired words are the only truly "holy writings."

Q. How does God carry out His will in the world?


A. Just as God used His word to create. the world, He also uses it to carry out His will in the world. **Isaiah 55:11** – "So shall my word be that goeth forth out of my mouth: it shall not return unto me void, but it shall accomplish that which I please, and it shall prosper in the thing whereto I sent it."

Q. What is the greatest theme of the entire Bible?

A. The greatest theme throughout the entire Bible is the Lord Jesus Christ. Luke **24:26, 27** – "Ought not Christ to have suffered these things, and to enter into his glory? And beginning at Moses and all the prophets, he [Christ] expounded unto them in all the scriptures the things concerning himself."









- How can we know that the Bible really is the true Word of God?
- A. The Spirit of God helps us know that the Bible is true and that it is God's Word

1 Corinthians 2:12

"Now we have received. not the spirit of the world, but the spirit which is of God; that we might know the things that are freely given to us of God."



Many, many evidences exist that show the Bible is different from any other book, but it takes God Himself to assure a person that the Bible is God's own Book. God's Spirit works to convince people that His Word is true. The fact that only God can fully convince someone of the truth of His Word means people are dependent upon God's Spirit to know and understand God's Word. Human reason and logic are not enough to convince someone of the truthfulness of God's Word.



Seeing It Clearly

Do the following words look familiar to you? "We hold these truths to be selfevident, that all men are created equal, that they are endowed by their Creator with certain unalienable Rights, that among these are Life, Liberty and the pursuit of Happiness."

Those words are part of America's Declaration of Independence. In that document, the authors explain the truths they believe are "self-evident." They used the word "self-evident" to describe truths so powerful and so obviously true that they don't need an explanation or proof.

The Bible's truths speak with such power. clarity, and authority that they prove themselves to be true. The words and truths of the Bible are self-evident—that is, they show themselves to be true simply because they are! Our opinions or ability to understand the Bible do not affect its

self-evident truthfulness. The Bible is not dependent upon a court's decision or any other proof to establish its truthfulness. For there is no truth greater than God's own words.

Q. What proof do we have that the entire Old Testament is inspired?


A. Christ and His apostles spoke in the New Testament about the "Scriptures" (for them, the Old Testament) as having been given by God.

Q. Why did believers in Jesus' day have assurance that Jesus' teachings were from God?

A. God gave believers the ability to recognize Jesus' teachings as divine. **John 7:17** – "If any man will do his [God's] will, he shall know of the doctrine [teaching], whether it be of God, or whether I speak of myself."









- How did God give us the Bible?
- A. God inspired holy men to write down His words exactly as He wanted.

2 Peter 1:21

"For the prophecy came not in old time by the will of man: but holy men of God spake as they were moved by the Holy Ghost."



Every single person is affected by sin, so everyone naturally makes mistakes and disobeys. So if we did not believe that God inspired men to write His Word, then we would have to treat the Bible like any other common book. God's inspiration makes the Bible divine even though it had human writers.

God did not need men to write His Word, but He chose to use them. God used imperfect writers to record His Word to humanity. Human beings simply could

not have written something like the Bible without God's supernatural involvement. The fact that God used human beings is a demonstration of His awesome greatness. It would be like our using ants to build the tallest skyscraper!



Did You Know?

Did you know that God inspired both the words and the human writers of the Bible? Second Peter 1:21 teaches that the writers were inspired. And 2 Timothy 3:16 teaches that the words themselves were inspired.



Christian Word


The word "inspiration" means something has been "God-breathed." In fact the word for "inspired" in the original Greek language is a combination of the word for "God" and the word for "breathed." When we say that the words of Scripture are "inspired," we mean they are words that came directly

from God, as if He were using His breath to communicate the words. When we say that the writers of Scripture were guided by inspiration, that means God was moving in them and through them to write down exactly what He wanted.



Seeing It Clearly

Musicians blow air through woodwind instruments to produce the sounds they want. God breathed His Spirit through His holy servants to write down His Word exactly the way He wanted.

Q. Are the New Testament writers as reliable as the Old Testament writers?

A. Yes. Every Scripture writer was moved by the Holy Spirit to write down God's exact words. **2 Peter 3:2** – "That ye may be mindful of the words which were spoken before by the holy prophets, and of the commandment of us the apostles of the Lord and Savior."

Q. Did the holy men write the Bible exactly as God wished?

A. Yes. He had them write it just as if He had written every word Himself.

Q. Are there any examples of God writing words of Scripture Himself?

A. Yes. God used His finger to write the Ten Commandments on tablets of stone (Exodus 31:18).







- Does the Bible teach any errors or lies?
- A No God's Word is true and without error because God tells only the truth.

Psalm 119:160

"Thy word is true from the beginning: and every one of thy righteous judgments endureth for ever."



God never lies. The Bible is the Word of God. Therefore, the Bible never lies.

Some people disagree with the three sentences above. They think that this kind of thinking must be simpleminded. But the apostle Paul used the same type of thinking to show that the Bible is true. Titus 1:2 says, "In hope of eternal life, which God, that cannot lie, promised before the world began [before creation]."

The Bible was perfectly inspired by God, communicated without error or falsehoods. and preserved for us to read today. The Bible is always right and true because its Author is always right and true. God's truthfulness and inspiration of His Word make the Bible trustworthy.



Christian Word

Since the Bible teaches that it is inspired, we know that it has to also be "inerrant." The word "inerrant" simply means "without error." The original Latin word actually meant "to wander not." Whatever is inerrant does not "wander" away from truth. When we use "inerrant" to describe the Bible, it means God gave His Word with no mistakes. The next time you see the word "inerrant," you should remember that the Bible speaks the truth without any error. It sticks to the truth.

Did You Know?

Did you know that the Bible contain the lies and false information of both people and Satan? For example, Jacob lied to his father, Isaac, when he pretended to be Esau (Genesis 27:18–24). But the Bible truthfully reports what the liars said. The report, not the lie, is true.

A. Psalm 12:6 – "The words of the LORD are pure words: as silver tried in a furnace of earth, purified seven times."

Q. Will the Bible ever cease to exist?

A. No. God's Word is eternal. **1 Peter 1:25** – "But the word of the Lord endureth for ever. And this is the word which by the gospel is preached unto you."







The Bible Is All about God

Have you ever turned over a rock to see what was underneath it? Before you turned it over, there was no way you could tell for sure. But once you moved the rock, it revealed everything—the worms, beetles, ants, and weird bugs—that had been hidden.

There is a lot we could never know about God without opening His Book to read about Him and observe His Son, Jesus. Through Jesus and the Bible, God reveals Himself to us so we can learn all about

Him. But we won't learn much of anything about God if we don't open the Bible.

Since God is so much greater than we are, we needed Him to teach us Who He is in a way we could comprehend. He made His Word understandable so we could learn about Him. If we recognize that the Bible is all about God, we will learn from His Word to know and glorify Him.

The word "revelation" refers to the communication of divine truth from God to people.

A. It does not; no language has enough words to express the full glory of God, nor could we even comprehend it (John 21:25).

The Bible does teach us everything we need to know about God now.

Q. How do we know that God exists?

A. We know that God exists by observing His creation, by recognizing our own sense of right and wrong, and by reading what He says about Himself in the Bible.

Q. What is the difference between the living Word and the written Word of God?

A. The living Word of God, Jesus, declared in the flesh Who God is. The written Word of God, the Bible, declares in written form Who God is.







- O. Can we be sure that God's Word is still good and true for us today?
- A. Yes. God has preserved His Word to be good and true forever. It never changes.

Matthew 5:18

"For verily I say unto you, Till heaven and earth pass, one jot or one tittle shall in no wise pass from the law, till all be fulfilled."



God's Word is different than all other books. It remains meaningful and significant for all people of all times because it is God's living Book, filled with God's living words! First Peter 1:23 says, "Being born again, not of corruptible seed, but of incorruptible, by the word of God, which liveth and abideth for ever."

We can be confident that the Bible is reliable for us today because God has promised to preserve it forever and

because God's completed Word never needs to be updated or changed. God made no mistakes in giving His Word to humanity. God's Word is as necessary and appropriate for people today as it was the day it was completed nearly two thousand years ago.



Christian Word

The word "preservation" refers to God's ministry of protecting His Word throughout time. It will never go away nor fail to come true.

• Why do we need the Bible?

A. We need the Bible to show us Who God is and how we can be right with Him through Jesus Christ.

2 Timothy 3:15

"And that from a child thou hast known the holy scriptures, which are able to make thee wise unto salvation through faith which is in Christ Jesus."



Above all else, God created us to glorify Him. To glorify God is to praise Him and make known how wonderful He is. But we don't glorify God naturally. There is a change that needs to take place in our lives first. That change begins when we trust in Jesus as our Savior from our sins.

This step is so important that the apostle John wrote his entire Gospel about trusting in Jesus as Savior. He said in **John 20:31**, "But these are written, that ye might believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God; and that believing ye might have life through his name." John presents Jesus as the perfect Son of God Who offers sinners like us salvation from sin.

To be saved is to first admit you are a sinner and deserve to be punished by God (Romans 3:23; 6:23). God must punish sinners because He is holy and just. But God lovingly provided a payment for our sins by sending Jesus to earth (Romans 5:8).

Jesus lived a perfect life, willingly submitted to being crucified as the payment for our sins, and then rose from the dead victorious over sin and death (1 Corinthians 15:3, 4).

God promised eternal life to all those who believe on Jesus Christ as the satisfactory payment for their sins (Romans 6:23). Acts **16:31** says, "Believe on the Lord Jesus Christ, and thou shalt be saved." To believe on Jesus is to place your trust fully in Him.

Belief in Jesus is central to the Bible's message, so it is organized around Jesus' life. The Old Testament looks ahead to the coming of Christ; the New Testament is




about the actual coming of Christ and the events that happened afterwards.

Q. What is the Bible's role in salvation?

A. The Spirit of God uses the Bible to convict people of their sin, convince them of the grace of God, and draw them to believe in Christ. **1 John 5:13** – "These things have I written unto you that believe on the name of the Son of God; that ye may know that ye have eternal life, and that ye may believe on the name of the Son of God."

Q. What is one verse that teaches we must know God in order to be saved?

A. John 17:3 – "And this is life eternal, that they might know thee the only true God, and Jesus Christ, whom thou hast sent."

Q. How can you learn to know God?

A. By God's grace I can learn to know God by His Word, by His Son, and by His works.







- How can we truly get to know God?
- A. We get to know God by faith, which comes from hearing His Word.

Romans 10:17

"So then faith cometh by hearing, and hearing by the word of God."



We can learn some general truths about God from His Creation. A thunderstorm, for instance, might speak to us of His power. while the stars could speak of His greatness. In addition, our inner sense of right and wrong, called our conscience, is a clue that there must be a higher Being Who has a standard for our behavior.

Creation and conscience give people enough understanding of God to show them that God must exist. Because of that basic understanding of God, no one will have an excuse when God judges them for their sins. Romans 1:20 says, "For the invisible things of him [God] from the creation of the world are clearly seen, being understood by the things that are made, even his eternal power and Godhead; so that they are without excuse."

But Creation and conscience do not provide people with enough understanding of God to lead them to believing in Christ for salvation. People need to know more specific information about Christ, the object of all saving faith.

Saving faith must come from God and by the Word of God. God's Word tells us all we need to know about Christ in order to put our trust in Him for salvation. Thankfully, the Bible is not missing any information that keeps us from faith in Christ. The Bible reveals everything we need to know about salvation.

A. No. **Acts 10:43** – "To him [Christ] give all the prophets witness, that through his name whosoever believeth in him shall receive remission of sins."

A. No. **John 8:31, 32** – "Then said Jesus to those Jews which believed on him, If ye continue in my word, then are ye my

disciples indeed; and ye shall know the truth, and the truth shall make you free."

We should read the Bible, study it, hear it preached, believe it, and live according to it. **Joshua 1:8** – "This book of the law shall not depart out of thy mouth; but thou shalt meditate therein day and night, that thou mayest observe to do according to all that is written therein: for then thou shalt make thy way prosperous, and then thou shalt have good success."

Nine judges in the United States have supreme judicial authority. When the Supreme Court speaks, their words and decisions outweigh all other judges' decisions.

Like the rulings of those top judges, the Bible is the supreme authority. All other books should be considered less authoritative than God's Word. The truthfulness of all other writings or teachings must be carefully measured by the Bible. The Bible is the source for everything a Christian believes and teaches.

As the supreme authority, the Bible is profitable for four reasons. **Second Timothy 3:16** tells us those reasons.

Doctrine – God's Word teaches us what to believe. "Here's what's right."

Reproof – God's Word convinces us of our sin. "Here's what's wrong."

Correction – God's Word corrects our sinful ways. "Here's how to make right what's wrong."

Instruction in righteousness – God's Word leads us to act and live in a way pleasing to God. "Here's how to keep right what's right."

The Bible is profitable because the Holy Spirit actively convinces people of its truth. When a pastor preaches the Word, he can count on the Holy Spirit to convince people that the Bible is right and true.

The Spirit gives the Bible power unlike any other book by making God's Word real in people's hearts.



Q. How powerful is the Bible compared to all other books?

A. The Bible is the only truly powerful

book. **Hebrews 4:12** – "For the word of God is quick, and powerful, and sharper than any twoedged sword, piercing even to the dividing asunder of soul and spirit, and of the joints and marrow, and is a discerner of the thoughts and intents of the heart."

Q. Does God command us to submit to the Bible's authority?

A. Yes. **Psalm 119:4** – "Thou hast commanded us to keep thy precepts diligently."

Q. What will happen if we hear and practice the Word of God?

A. We will be blessed! **Luke 11:28** – "But he said, Yea rather, blessed are they that hear the word of God, and keep it."

Have you ever received an important text or note from someone who loved you very much? Did you read it more than once? How did it affect you?

Augustine, a great Christian teacher from the days of the early church, said the Scriptures are like "letters from home." He is right!

We should not approach the Bible as if it was a school textbook filled with facts. God has given us His Word so that we might know Him personally. So we should read

God's Word as a personal letter from God and as expression of His love for us. We should eagerly respond to its message and gladly place ourselves under its authority.

God commands all people to read, hear, and understand the Scriptures. **John 5:39** says, "Search the scriptures; for in them ye think ye have eternal life: and they are they which testify of me." **Acts 17:11** says, "These were more noble than those in Thessalonica, in that they received the word with all readiness of mind, and searched the scriptures daily, whether those things were so."

Did You Know?

A. The Spirit of God helps us know that the Bible is true and that it is God's Word. 1 Corinthians 2:12 – "Now we have received, not the spirit of the world, but the spirit which is of God; that we might

know the things that are freely given to us of God."

A. God inspired holy men to write down His words exactly as He wanted. 2 Peter 1:21 – "For the prophecy came not in old time by the will of man: but holy men of God spake as they were moved by the Holy Ghost."

A. No. God's Word is true and without error because God tells only the truth. **Psalm 119:160** – "Thy word is true from the beginning: and every one of thy righteous judgments endureth for ever."

Q. What does the Bible teach us?






